Don't risk your ride!

A three-month warning period has commenced for mobile device detection cameras. During this period, motorists detected by the cameras using their mobile device while driving will receive a written warning. Infringements will start being issued from February 2024.

ACT Policing will continue to issue infringement notices for mobile device offences they detect. The warning period only applies to mobile detection cameras.

Taylor's first Community Diwali Celebration is coming!

The Festival of Lights will soon shine over Taylor with a community-organised Diwali celebration to be held in the **Margaret Hendry School gymnasium on Saturday 18 November from 5:00pm – 9:00pm**. This event is open to all Taylor residents, those who celebrate Diwali and those who would like to experience it. ACT Container Deposit Scheme is the smart way to recycle!

Return your empty drink bottles, cans, and cartons through the ACT Container Deposit Scheme (CDS) and receive a 10c refund for each eligible container, while protecting the environment at the same time. Most drink containers between 150ml and 3L are eligible. Look for the 10c refund mark on the label.

There are 22 return points across the ACT, including cash-back depots, reverse vending machines, Drop and Go pods, and Drop and Go points.

If you're not near a return point, the home collection service offered by ReCollect may be for you, **acteds.org.au/recollect**
